

I used to live my life in a constant state of procrastination. I remember when I would tell myself that I would do this thing or that thing tomorrow. I'll wait until the time is right to write that book. I'll go to the gym tomorrow when I am not as tired. I'll wait until the new year to set those goals, or wait until I have enough money to start that business. Sometimes we all have very little to show for the time that is provided to us.
